## Conclave continued: Gymkhana on Monday

The course started with a tight right 120 degree turn, but since it was first gear, not too bad. We saw plenty of effects from a half tank of gas, low tire pressure, and slow hands on the wheel. Nobody damaged a wheel on the curbs, but many seemed to be misfiring after their third run. We kept the cars ready to run in 4-car groups, with each car completing their three runs in one session. Then they could reload the boot, and park in an adjacent area to spectate or depart. The continuous flow of cars up from the conclave seemed to fit well with the available paddock space and the need for fresh Healeys to be flogged.

The nimble Sprites enjoyed the course the most. The 28.81 second FTD was a flat black painted, forced-induction Sprite. As the morning warmed-up, the big Healey times seemed to get longer. It may have been an advantage to have arrived and ran early. After all the cars ran, around noon, Bluegrass had bags of box lunches delivered. After the last remaining stragglers ran we repacked the trailer (maybe not as neatly as it was packed by Bob Duffey, but it looked great in the fresh white paint).
