

turn right. Go .4 mile to Genenbill Dr. on right. Turn right to 613 (on mailbox)
Parking is available in our driveway, and at the Metropolitan Sewer District's new pad. next door. (On the other side of the arbor vitae.

From the Far North. Take I 275 West to I74 South. Once on 74south toward Cincinnati, take the first exit on the right to Rybolt Rd. . Turn left on Rybolt, and an immediate right onto Harrison Avenue.. Take Harrison Ave. to Glenway and turn right. Take Glenway to Westborn, and again, turn right. There is a large Bowling Alley on the corner, and it is directly across from a a major health center.. Take Westborn to Muddy Creek, a 3 way stop. Turn left on Muddy Creek, and then a right on Neeb rd. Take Neeb rd. all the way to Foley Rd. Another 3 way stop. Turn left onto Foley, and about I/2 mile, turn left onto Genenbill.

From I 71 south or north bound, as well as 471, follow the 50 west signs from Fort Washington Way. That route is open to River Rd. There is considerable construction, but follow the barrels signs and cones and you will get to River Rd. The traffic closes down to one lane. Be sure to follow the signs and STAY RIGHT TO RIVER RD. GO SLOW BECAUSE THE ROAD IS ROUGH THROUGH THERE. Once you are passed the maze rd is fine the rest of the way. Take River Rd. to Fairbanks Ave. Traffic light and Ball Park on the corner. Fairbanks will bear left, merge and become Delhi Pike. Stay on Delhi pike to Anderson Ferry Rd. Shopping center /Walgreens on the left corner. Turn right on Anderson Ferry to Foley Rd.Speedway and on corner. Turn left, of .4miles to Genenbill dr on the right. 513 451 1120

TECH SESSION REPORT:

Thanks for all the help in reassembling my transmission yesterday. Special thanks to Richard for machining a shift linkage cup, since the Moss Motors nylon one did not fit. I plan to have it installed this next week at home. I'm also including a few photos of the crew yesterday at Richard's. The two paragraph summary for the next Newsleak follows:

An experienced crew of tinkerers started at Richard Pratts shop on Friday, April 5 to reassemble Tim Ross's BJ8 transmission. Besides Richard and Tim, the helpers included Bob Merten, Skip Jackson, and Bernie Grabow. Richards's BJ8 shop manual was invaluable, the Moss Motors catalog helped somewhat. New items installed included 3rd and 4th gear synchronizers, layshaft and bearings, tailshaft bearing, all overdrive O-rings, overdrive actuation solenoid, throwout bearing, and misc. gaskets and seals. Bernie sold Tim a nearly-new first gear, to replace Tim's chipped one. Richard made a slick holder out of some exhaust tubing to keep the three spring-loaded ball sets in place for installation, and machined a new shift linkage cup. Everything seemed to go back together, only one ball was left over (?), and we forgot to install the new 2nd gear synchro. We'll see soon if the incredibly messy Toyota sealant works to replace some of the gaskets, and minimize the gearbox leaks.

Advice for future tinker gatherings is to lay out all the parts to be assembled in exploded diagram order on clean paper towels beforehand – this checks that you have ALL the parts ready. Remove all old parts from sight or they may be reused. Throw away all old lock washers and have a box of new automotive grade 5 lock washers available for each size. Check that your old silicone sealant tube has not hardened into a rock. Try not to have all your shops' electrical outlets and motors on a single circuit. And of course the primary directive is to have LOTS OF COLD BEER!

Conclusion

During this battle, he figures he spent a couple hundred hours researching law, chasing leads, playing detective, talking on the phone, sending emails and documenting his efforts. "And that doesn't count the time I lay in bed, unable to sleep, trying to think

of ways to solve problems," he adds. He acknowledges that he had a lot of help, and he has nothing but praise for everyone who assisted, including the police, "I know these guys are busy, but they went out of their way to help," he says, "I was amazed,"

He also reflects on key turning points in his saga: "If I hadn't canceled the theft insurance in 1970, the insurance company would have paid me off, none of this would ever have happened," And his chance eBay find? "Unbelievable," he says. Plus, at each step of his battle, what were the odds of finding the right person with the right information who was willing to help? Yet this happened numerous times, Bob believes that his unlikely, off-the-wall story drew them in, "Who could make something like that up?" he asks.

What about the dealership that listed the car? When the police seized the Healey, they lost their claim to owner-ship-and possibly their investment. However, the law does provide recourse if they chose to track the ownership trail to the thief and seek compensation. Since Bob got his car back, he has mellowed a bit. "They were victimized, too," he says. He also has some pointed advice for the guy who stole his Healey, wherever he is, it's instructive, but we can't print it here.

When we caught up with Bob, he was a happy man, covered with grease, waist-deep in his long-lost toy, In fact, he was standing in the Healey's empty engine bay, painting the firewall. The freshly painted engine and transmission stood nearby, Boxes of parts littered the garage, along with a set of shiny chrome wire wheels, complete with new tires, A pair of Healey seats resided in his office, and his desk was piled with parts catalogs, These days, he still spends a lot of time on the phone-not talking to lawyers, but ordering parts and chatting with other Healey owners.

With the help of Pat Yoas from the North Texas Austin-Healey Club, Bob contacted Healey expert Bret Blades, and Bob and Bret are now refreshing the car in Bob's garage. They're working from a long list, which includes new brake and fuel lines, a gas tank, hydraulic seals, and electrical and interior work. They plan to turn over the car to a shop for bodywork and paint. "It will never be a show car," Bob explains, "but it will be a nice driver, and I intend to drive it." Once the Healey is back on the road, Bob says he'll pick up where he left off in 1970-owner and car both trying to make up for all those lost years together. Of course, Cindy is invited, too,

But Bob vows that two things have changed: Today the Healey is fully insured, and he swears he will never again park it overnight on the street,
