

Ms. Go/Mr. Whoa: Ladies First ('n Guys) Gym-

For a Sunday summer morning, June 29, on the cusp of July, the only steaminess came from the autocross course, as the ladies revved up for the first front and center action of the day. Cool, breezy, overcast-to-anemically sunny conditions prevailed, thwarting intermittent threats of rain, intense brightness and heat, to the relief of all, and, especially the course workers.

Nine ladies graced Don Klein's always-a-challenge configured courses in the north and south lots. Sounds of engines roaring, shifting/downshifting, and tires screeching added to visual delights. The ladies were clearly channeling their inner Pat Moss/ Ann Wisdom/Janet Guthrie with strong performances in their bid to challenge each of their six runs for personal best times.

As the morning progressed, crowds multiplied to a spectator/participant total of 47, including a family-friendly number of 6 kids. What a great turnout! Pleased to see OVAHC members Troy and Lauren Davidson, and appreciated their assistance.

Ladies Day OVAHC Drivers' Training results:

Nicole Robichard drove the street legal 2012 black Porsche GT3 aggressively to net the fastest time of the ladies at 57.33 seconds.

Pat Duffey in her blue with white striped Bugeye Sprite maintained her usual confident, steady driving, shaving time with each successive run to a sixth run fastest time of 64.27. Dale Ann Watkins in her 2000 merlot Miata trimmed her personal best by 19.15 seconds, earning most improved in reading the course, and reducing her personal best time to a final run of 60.09.

Debbie Mauro made some driving drama in her 2013 (?) black Porsche Carrera S 911, swerving-to-fishtailing on the north to south lot approach, but, with "grace under fire "determination, she maintained course, DNF-free, for a personal best final of 61.26.

Kimberleigh Szaz in a 2006 copper red Miata (shared by two other drivers), proved a strong driver, at ease and having fun! She consistently trimmed her six-run time by 14.06 seconds to a final 58.67.

CJ Savage, driving the same copper red Miata, also demonstrated strong driving skill, manipulating the course to trim her first-to-sixth run by 14.11, for a final 62.66.

Rebecca Davis cranked up the black 2009 Honda Fit (completely stock and street tires), and the car radio, audibly blaring, enjoying the course and cutting her time by 11.15 seconds to a final 67.64.

Aprille Burger revved up her 2005 blue Mini and wowed the crowd with aggressive maneuvers, "grabbing rubber" in two gears. Despite two DNF runs, her course reading improved for a personal best of 63.95.

Karyn Fogle drove her 1996 charcoal grey Miata, steadily improving to pare her first-to-sixth run by 17.82 seconds for a final 64.51 finish. Hers was a respectable performance, considering sleep deprivation (worked all night), and a first time drivers' training experience.

Vicki Jensen was a hopeful, but disappointed driver of a salmon/white Nash Metropolitan that, according to her husband (and frequent Drivers' Training participant), Doug Jensen, "needed just 10 more minutes to adjust the brakes" to avoid overheating the brakes, which occurred, during their trip to Live Oaks Vocational School. Working for the last two weeks to get the car running, making needed mechanical adjustments,

and qualified for Drivers' Training, installing a seat belt ("hurt to drill a hole"), Doug revived the Metropolitan that had been parked since 1983. He now has a front brake rebuild on his To Do list. Maybe the 2015 Gymkhana for Vicki and that cute Metropolitan.

THANKS to all the volunteers and workers who provided equipment, designed /set up the course, observed/patrolled the course, teched cars/ instructed drivers, timed and recorded results, (including Don Kelly who, with instant on-the-jobtraining time recording, presenting courtesy on the course by politely thanking each course worker exchange).
