A cool, comfortably sunny morning gave way to a steady rise in temps. We were able to complete all runs by early afternoon to beat much of the soon-to-sizzle heat.

Mr. Whoa: Yes, it was great to have plenty of shade and a nice breeze on this Saturday, September 5 Labor Day weekend.

Ms. Go: For a holiday weekend we had a good turnout, including 17 of our very own OVAHC members, who numbered more than half the crowd. We had a total of over thirty folks including spectators and drivers.

Mr. Whoa: Salute to those Healey Club members who came to show their support to work, watch, and/or drive. Don Klein set up a wide open course with a Peterson box in the big lot. We allowed each group to do all six runs without stopping.

Ms. Go: Yes, and they all did their turn working the course that went through both lots. It was a decent turnout with fourteen drivers. They looked like they had lots of fun with wide grins to prove it. Everyone read and maneuvered the course well, steadily shaving their times for each one of their six runs.
