Tech Team Report







Nate Fuson's tech session 1/21/18

Nate reported that he will need a club member to take care of his Sprite at the Conclave this year. He can't attend all the events of the week, but wants his Sprite at the car show.

On Sunday, January 21, the OVAHC tech team of Richard Pratt, Bernie Grabow, Dale Ballinger, Chris Wolfer and Tim Ross, met at the Nate Fuson shop in Latonia Station for (hopefully) the last tech session on Nate's Sprite. The car looks great, and we think we finished with the installation of the grill, rough aiming of the headlights, bled the hydraulic clutch (for the fourth

time – finally got the pedal hard, but wore out Gayle' left leg), modified the trunk weather-stripping, and installed the radio console with speakers. We had good weather that Sunday, so Nate and Chris were able to drive away for a short shakedown cruise – reporting back that all went well. Our one follow-up is to get and install a "shorter" radio that will fit in the space we have for the console.





Tech Team Report continued

On Friday Feb 2 (Groundhog Day), the OVAHC tech team met at the Jake Jacobs shop to start to assemble two rib-case Sprite transmissions for Japan. All the parts had been cleaned, the new parts from Moss were sorted, new bearings installed in place of the old ones, ditto the seals. We looked over all the parts we had from at least four disassembled transmission and made sure (we think) that we have two good sets of similar parts for final assembly. We could not complete the assembly due to the first gears not arriving from Moss; as it turned-out they arrived to the Porada shop the next day. So we will meet again on Friday Feb

16 to hopefully complete the assemblies.



The OVAHC tech group met at the yellow Bugeye of John Haines this past Friday, 2/9/18. The initial problem of not wanting to run was quickly solved by Richard with the addition of some gas, even tho' the gauge read half full. We should have told John Haines that

the gauges are seldom accurate. Then the tech team deduced that the battery was not being charged, so the voltage regulator and new-looking generator were suspect. In doing some trouble shooting, the wire from the voltage regulator to the charging light on the dash smoked and shorted. This really excited the tech team - now something to work on! The regulator and generator were removed. Richard consulted the service manuals, and the first problem seemed to be an unsoldered wire in the regulator. The team then made a short road trip, en masse, to Hamilton's starter, alternator repair shop at 3353 Madison Pike, Ft. Wright, KY (phone 859-578-8080). Bad news – they had never seen a Lucas regulator, and had no parts. Good news - they seemed to have starters, alternators, water pump parts for every other car. They should be able to rebuild Lucas generators since they were used on old Ford tractors. They may also be able to replace the leaking water pump seals on Healeys, as they seem to have a large collection of different seals. We were shown the many back shops and warehouses containing a huge collection of electrical item (and some train and RR stuff). Nice helpful guys who may be able to help all OVAHC members. We went back and soldered the wire in the regulator ourselves, then thoroughly checked out the generator, and pronounced it new and good. Dale ran to get some matching yellow primary wire to replace the smoked one. And with everything back together and the new wire, the Bugeye started and ran well and the generator seemed to start charging the battery. Thanks to Richard, Bernie, Skip, Dale and Tim for helping John get the car running well.

After a 19 month gap in the restoration process, the tech team reconvened at the Davidson garage to see if we could finally get Winston on the road. Lauren had a good list of items to check, and the tech team started with putting fresh gas in the new gas tank (no leaks – good), changing the thermostat and gasket (thanks to Don Klein for the parts), which needed silicone to really stop the weeping, new antifreeze mixture, Dale checked the horns – sounded like a wounded duck – will need new ones, the brakes seemed to work ok, ditto the clutch, the battery had been left without a trickle charger so it needed to be charged. Bernie started fitting the seat frames. The primary concern was the wiring, which Richard, Lauren and Troy worked on. Once we had some voltage from the battery to work with, we tried the new gear-reduction starter – no turning! The troubleshooting involved the starter solenoids, and the motor rotation. With the car in gear, and with a group push, the engine would not rotate – RATS! On a warm sunny afternoon, the mood in the garage was overcast. Various bad scenarios to the engine non-rotation were discussed, some plans were made to move the car to another garage and pull the engine for more checks. As we packed-up, unlikely as it seemed, Dale Ballinger noticed that the new fan belt was not in the crankshaft pulley groove and instead was jammed between the front engine cover and the pulley. With this quickly removed, the push check worked, the starter turned the flywheel a little and everyone was again happy! We still have a few items to go for the next tech session, and then to get the motor started and out for the first test drive – but Spring is on the way.
