From north of Cincy: Using 71 or 75, take 275 east/south toward Kentucky Take exit 52 (Loveland/Indian Hill) Left on Loveland Maderia Road (get in right lane) Turn right on East Kemper Road Turn right onto West Loveland Road (its at the stop sign and it's a 4 lane road) Get into left lane of W. Loveland and go over bridge Turn right on South 2nd Street (first road after railroad tracks) Turn Left on Obannon Avenue (first street on the left, if you go up the hill you've missed it) Go all the way down Obannon (it turns into a 1 lane road after the cul-de-sac) Turn right at the end of the street, that's my driveway). If you end up in the creek you went about 15 feet too far. From Kentucky and south of Cincy: When traveling on west/north 275: Get off at Exit 54 (Wards Corner Road) Turn right on Wards Corner Turn right on OH-48/Paxton Ave/South 2nd Street Turn Right onto Obannon Avenue (first street on right at the bottom of the hill If you pass a gas station on the right you went to far) Go all the way down Obannon (it turns into a 1 lane road after the cul-de-sac) Turn right at the end of the street, that's my driveway).

If you end up in the creek you went about 15 feet too far.

Tech Team



On Feb 23 the tech team of Richard, Bernie, Tim & Skip met at the Jacobs shop to troubleshoot the transmissions that we previously reassembled – but seemed to have issues: noisy and tight. We found the input shaft and gear from the noisy one was 948 cc part (19 teeth) versus the needed 20 tooth 1275 trans shaft. So it came out and we had a choice of two 20 tooth shafts, Richard choose one but the new input bearing had to be carefully swapped to the right shaft. Then the reassembly proceeded. This brought us to the next challenge: the selector rods and their mysterious balls. Trying to read and interpret the instructions from a service manual was difficult, Richard read, and Bernie, Skip and Tim tried to follow. At the end of the day the input shaft replacement (mostly) solved the gear clashing noise, but the shifting was not right. We'll be back to address that next time. Jake was kind to allow us into the shop while he and Joyce attended the birth of their first grandchild Ella – congratulations to all!

On March 2, we were back with a better shop manual that actually showed diagrams of the shifting rod ball placements. One needs to add the balls in a certain order after turning the transmission to a specific orientation for gravity to help keep the balls in place. We followed the official BMC "Austin Healey Sprite Workshop Manual" and finished the reassembles. One transmission, after adding some ATF for lubrication, rotated quietly and shifted well through all the gears – DONE. The other transmission would not shift or rotate indicating two gears selected together. We pulled the shifting rods and found that we had some 948 parts still mixed in! With an inspected and blessed set of shift rods, the reassembly (went quicker the fourth time) got us back to the final tests. But that transmission still had too much gear noise in first and reverse and will not shift smoothly – so a new 1275 certified reverse gear is to be ordered unless Moss can advise us on the proper reverse gear part number. We suspect that the reverse gear might be a 948 part and interfering with first gear rotation. At least we got one ready to crate! The moral of the story is keep the damn 948 parts away from the area when building a 1275 gearbox, the parts may look the same but are of slightly different dimensions and don't mix!



On Friday, March 9, 2018, Richard Pratt, Jake Jacobs and Tim Ross met to finally finish the assembly of the second Sprite rib-case transmission for Japan. Jake and Jeff Porada had ordered and received a new reverse gear, made in Italy, which should guarantee the proper mesh of the teeth. Since we had soooo much experience with disassembling and reassembling the transmissions, the change-out of the gear went quickly. We were cautious with the selection of shift rods, etc., used plenty of grease on the synchros, bearings and gears, and all new lockwashers under the nuts. Lo and behold ! the reassembled box rotated and shifted great. Now Jake will make crates and have them shipped to his friends in Japan. Richard and I declined the offer to go into business rebuilding Sprite gearboxes – but for anyone else, you need to read the manuals, go slowly on the disassembly with many photos of the steps, and above all only work on one gearbox at a time. Regards - Tim
