

TECH REPORT



On Tuesday, 5/21/19, the OVAHC Tech Team of Richard, Bernie, Tim, and new member Stephen Street, met at the garage of Greg Garnett north of Oxford to try to get his '66 BJ8 started. We had hoped to install the carbs with new floats, and install a new fuel tank and proceed from there. However the new steel fuel tank arrived with significant dents on the seams from shipping that had us questioning the gas-tight integrity. Then the rear carb, when set in place, with the choke linkage attached, would not fully operate. Back on the bench for more disassembly, where we discovered that the bottom diaphragm had turned to Bakelite. More disassembly showed plenty of discoloration/residue, so a full cleaning is required. We probably should have done this as a matter of course for 20 year idle carbs. More on the parts list for Greg to order

for next time. And we haven't even started on the ignition system. Greg got some

DOT 3 brake fluid and he had installed new master cylinders, so with a full brake/clutch reservoir we expected to bleed the brakes. Tim went around and loosened the bleed nipples, and broke off the one on the RR, and rounded the flats on the LR. Probably should have sprayed it all with PB Blaster last session. This led the full team to remove the rear brakes to get to and remove the two rear slave cylinders – plenty of tough nuts and greasy drum brake parts. More parts for Greg's order list – he just wanted to get it running to sell it – not restore it! So about that time UPS came with the second replacement fuel tank. When removed from the shipping box, it too, had a series of dents around the



corner seams. So Greg will partially fill each of the new tanks and select the one that, hopefully, doesn't leak. All for next time, stay tuned. Another great pizza and homemade wine lunch followed.





On Tuesday, June 18, Richard, Gayle, Skip and Tim met at the Merten garage to try again to get the #6 intake valve to operate. Richard intended to try a lubricant, but the valve tappet covers prevent oil from penetrating. Video borescope of the top of the pistons showed no damage. Richard then tried a "compressed rope" trick to force the intake valve to close – hoping that getting some movement will loosen the valve stem in the guide. We fed 36 feet of parachute cord into the #6 cyl. and tried to move the bundle under the intake valve. Then, by rocking the car in gear, we got the piston to rise and push the intake valve closed somewhat (as measured by feeler guages). We repeated the process a number of times, but the intake valve would not return to the closed position by just its spring. The next step is to have the head removed and reconditioned (\$\$).
