TECH SESSION



This was the second gathering for new suspension installation, there will be at least one more before getting a complete "rolling chassis". We all enjoyed our NEW OVAHC Tech Team hats – making us a much more professional group. See the team photo. Tim has the hats for tech team participants who were not at this session. We are still stymied by finding the exact mix of shims to make the new roller -bearing upright on the LF have the proper

fit – the RF went okay. The differential gearing that was recently checked at the Yannone shop went into the rear axle housing with a new gasket and sealant. As was typical throughout all the assemblies; only NEW lock washers were used, with a lot of new bolting, and liberal use of anti-seize compound on bolts, etc. The rear axle was then hefted into place, and with multiple old guys = no sprains, bruises or blood. Mounting the rear springs could have been easier if Moss hadn't sent us 3 outer shackle links and one inner, instead of two of each. Some Dremel grinding converted one outer link to fit the inner location. Meanwhile most of the front suspension teams made substantial progress with bushings, A-arms, links, cross bolts, etc. The next session may use the to-be-relocated Pratt hydraulic press to more easily seat the front bearings. Ross still recommends the use of dry ice for its' -100 deg. F. temperature to chill the bearing races before installation into hubs.
