It is created with 3D computer aided design and produced with a 3D printer using carbon-fiber reinforced plastic that is tough, light, and durable.



#22. FUEL GAUGE

DOES YOUR FUEL GAUGE NEEDLE FLICK WILDLY WHEN DRIVING DOWN THE ROAD? THE CURE? GND. WHEN THE GAUGE LOSES ITS GROUND, IT CAN NOT READ CORECTLY, OR JUMPS.

1ST PLACE TO CHECK- MAKE SURE GAUGE CAN IS GROUNDED TO YOUR DASH. BRACKET THAT SECURES GAUGE HAS TO TOUCH BARE METAL. SOMETIMES MATERIAL IS WRAPPED THRU GAUGE HOLE AND INSULATES GAUGE BRACKET. REMOVE MATERIAL SO THE PRONGS TOUCH.

2ND PLACE TO CHECK-OVER YEARS THE TANK LOSES GROUND TO BODY FOR VARIOUS REASONS. RUN SEPARATE GROUND WIRE FROM BODY TO TANK SENDING UNIT. A 14-16 GAUGE WIRE WILL WORK FINE.

3RD PLACE TO CHECK-OVER YEARS OF USE THE PIVOT POINT OF SENDING UNIT GETS WORN AND NO LONGER STAYS IN CONTACT WITH UNIT BODY. THE ELECTRICAL CONTACTS ARE IN THE TOP OF THE UNIT AND THEY READ RESISTANCE BETWWENGROUND ANDRESISTER IN TOP OF UNIT. YOU NEED A GROUND BETWEEN UNIT BODY AND FLOAT. I USE A VERY LIGHT WIRE AND SOLDER IT TO ARM BETWEEN FLOAT AND PIVOT POINT. I STRIPPED INSULATION OFF A SPEAKER WIRESO GAS WOULD NOT SWELL UP INSULATION AND CREATE PROBLEM. I THEN PUT A SMALL ELECTRICAL EYE TYPE CONNECTOR ON OTHER END AND PICKED A PLACE ON BOTTOM OF SENDING UNIT THAT WOULD NOY INTERFERE WITH UNIT OR MOUNTING OF UNIT. SECURE IT WITH SMALLEST SHEET METEL SCREW YOU CAN. JUST HAS BE A GROUND AND DOES NOT CONDUCT ELECTRICITY.
