Rumblings

Greetings members and friends!

Well it was hard to follow up a great April of car events. The Easter Car Show and Healey Club Wash-Up Tune -Up were certainly memorable events. However, onward we go into prime driving season. On May 6, Jeff H. hosted an open house at It's Alive Automotive at its new Rock Road location. This is a really neat restoration shop with a



showroom up front and a huge work and storage area out back. There were several cars in progress on that day. A number of men were fabricating patch panels for a rusted E-Type and tuning a Triumph engine. An early Corvette (1954 or 1955) was in progress and looked quite promising: the body panels actually fit, which is rare on an early Corvette. Jeff explained that it was quite a job to achieve this fit. A 1969 Firebird convertible was stripped down and mounted on a rotisserie. The engine was neatly painted Pontiac blue and mounted on a stand. It reminded me of my 1968 Firebird convertible with "needs." I saw many British car friends, including Roy M. Roy is a long-time club member who was stricken with illness just before Christmas. Fortunately, he is now on the mend and plans to join our meetings in the future. Roy is quite a fine fellow and knows cars: in fact, he co-owned Triumph Motors in Waterloo, Illinois, when I first met him. He has moved and has a new phone number. Those members who would like to catch up may contact me for his phone number. May's Cars and Coffee at Westport was rather poorly attended, probably due to the threat of rain. My Triumph was the only car there that I considered "vintage." In spite of the fact that Triumphs are water soluble, the TR6 and I survived, with the wipers on the "slower" setting (as opposed to the "slow" setting). It amazes me that cars built in a place where it rains all the time have such small slow wipers and a quick blast of red

oxide for rustproofing! To quote Dave M. "They're miracle cars, water leaks in, oil leaks out!" And they said it couldn't be done. I met some car enthusiasts and heard about their cars and car experiences. Many people have some sort of a Triumph story. "Steve" told me about a TR6 his father had buried in his garage. They never finished restoration, but the next owner completed it. He now drives a 2011 Camaro with a supercharger on the already powerful V8. I also met a young fellow named Ryan. He had a 1990 three rotor Eunos (Mazda) Cosmo, which is apparently quite rare. He imported it from Japan as it was never sold in the US. Reportedly, you can import such a car once it reaches 25 years old even though it was never certified for US safety and emissions. Incidentally, it is right hand drive, like other Japanese home market cars. Oddly, the badges and controls are written in English. As you may recall, Mazda produced and imported a variety of two rotor Wankel engines. They are so different, it is fortunate that Ryan's father is a former Mazda mechanic! A Honda Beat roadster also caught my eye—it makes a Sprite look like a land yacht! It is fun hanging with car enthusiasts and learning their stories and car histories.

So many activities are around the corner. I'd like to highlight a few that I plan to attend. The Cobblestone Nationals is a huge show on Memorial Day. It is held at Fast Lane Classics in St. Charles. Mainly muscle cars and hot rods, it is cool nonetheless. The Memories Car Cruise in Fenton occurs the first Friday of the month and is a huge gathering as well. Most cars are rods and muscle, but I've seen a vintage Moon, a 1920 Dodge, a big Healey, an E-Type and various Sprites, Midgets and Triumphs as well. June 4 is the European Car Show at Taubman Mall. June 6-10 is the national Pierce-Arrow Convention. The host hotel is at Westport. A show occurs at the Museum of Transportation in Kirkwood on June 10. The Pierce-Arrow was an American luxury car that was often compared to the Rolls-Royce. I believe that the last one was produced in 1936. I bet this will be something to see. A Father's Day car show occurs on June 18 at the Museum of Transportation. Westport Plaza will host the national convention of the 1949-1959 Ford, Mercury, and Lincoln Club June 22, 23, 24.

Don't forget that May 27 through June 4 is "Drive Your British Car Week." Conclave is July 9 -14 in Waco, Texas (better take the air-conditioned BJ 9!). Be sure to see the Route 66 exhibit at the History Museum in Forest Park: it's cool and free and ends on July 16. Hang in there and remember to have fun, members!
