

Tech sessions

The Tech Team of Bernie Grabow, Dale Ballinger, Richard Pratt, Tim Ross, Skip Jackson, and Jerry Cox arrived at Brown's garage 9:30 Monday, February 20 ready for the challenges of installing a power brake booster and a new gas tank on a BT7 roadster.

The brake booster installation went without too many (the servo and its modified brackets were previously installed with the help of Jerry Cox to save some time). The new larger master cylinder installed fairly quickly with only a few dropped wrenches and the two new brake lines were bent and installed except for brake union fitting I had to join two lines was the wrong type. Jerry Cox and Dale went out to scour for the needed part with Dale getting to see more of Clermont County than he wanted to see.

Work had already been progressing on removing to old gas tank with its content OD 3/4 tank of gas (my bad). We filled a 6 gallon gas can and two 2 gallon cans. Since one of the previous owners has welded sheet metal under the supposed to be open tank sump, the location of the gas tank drain was carefully measured and a hole was cut so that the tank drain could be accessed from beneath the car - the hole was neatly filled with a rubber jack plug from a Bugeye. The new rubber gasket that should go under the gas tank to seal the sump area, raised the tank too high to make the fuel line connection so gasket was not used and the rubber mat that was under the old tank was used again as the sump area was sealed anyway. New tank straps were installed and we were ready to fill the tank with gas using a donated pant hose from Eileen stretched over a funnel to filter the rust particles from the old tank.

After the brake lines were finished and brakes bled, the only thing left to do was - go for a ride and test the new brakes! Richard climbed in the passenger seat and off we went - the brakes were great!!! I even locked up the back brakes in a somewhat hard stop.

Thanks to everyone for all the work (and the great social time doing it)! Scott
